### **[ PROPERTIES ]**

**Source:** Polyclonal antibody preparation

**Host:** Rabbit

**Purification:** Antigen-specific affinity chromatography followed by Protein A affinity chromatography

**Traits:** Liquid

**Immunogen:** Recombinant DKK3 (Pro41~Ile348) expressed in *E.coli*

**Accession No.:** RPD410Ra01

### **[ APPLICATIONS ]**

Western blotting: 0.01-2 $\mu$ g/mL;

Immunohistochemistry: 5-20 $\mu$ g/mL;

Immunocytochemistry: 5-20 $\mu$ g/mL;

Optimal working dilutions must be determined by end user.

### **[ FORMULATION ]**

**Form & Buffer:** Supplied as solution form in PBS, pH7.4, containing 0.02% NaN<sub>3</sub>, 50% glycerol.

### **[ STORAGE AND STABILITY ]**

**Storage:** Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles.

Store at 4°C for frequent use.

Aliquot and store at -20°C for 24 months.

**Stability Test:** The thermal stability is described by the loss rate. The loss rate was determined by accelerated thermal degradation test, that is, incubate the protein at 37°C for 48h, and no

obvious degradation and precipitation were observed. The loss rate is less than 5% within the expiration date under appropriate storage condition.

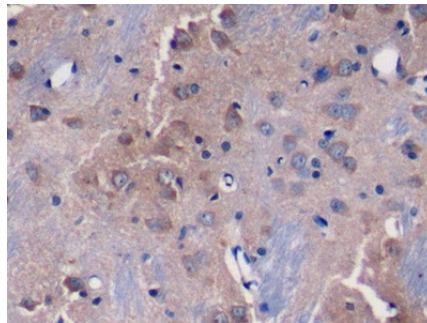
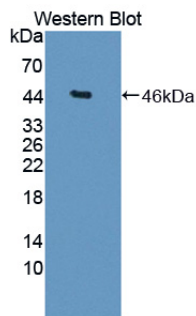


Figure. Western Blot; Sample:
