Buffer formulation: 20mM Tris, 150mM NaCl, pH8.0, containing 0.01% skl, 5%Trehalose.

Predicted isoelectric point: 5.3

Predicted Molecular Mass: 47.0kDa

Accurate Molecular Mass: 46kDa as determined by SDS-PAGE reducing conditions.

[**USAGE**]

Reconstitute in 20mM Tris, 150mM NaCl (pH8.0) to a concentration of 0.1-1.0 mg/mL. Do not vortex.

[**STORAGE AND STABILITY**]

Storage: Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles.

Store at 2-8°C for one month.

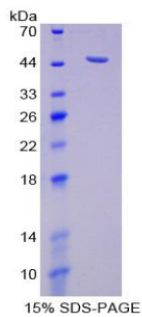
Aliquot and store at -80°C for 12 months.

Stability Test: The thermal stability is described by the loss rate. The loss rate was determined by accelerated thermal degradation test, that is, incubate the protein at 37°C for 48h, and no obvious degradation and precipitation were observed. The loss rate is less than 5% within the expiration date under appropriate storage condition.
